2018 was an amazing year for MACV because of the support of our donors, who believe in our mission to end homelessness for Veterans across Minnesota. Your gifts allow us to provide an immediate impact in supporting Veterans finding new jobs, new homes, and most importantly, a fresh start.

With the goal of achieving functional zero in the Veteran community within the next twelve to twenty four months, we expect to exceed our spending efforts again this year to make this a reality.

Here are five ways to help in 2019:

1. Make a monthly pledge. Small monthly donations make an impact on helping an at-risk Veteran. If everyone receiving this newsletter committed to \$10 a month, we would more than exceed our last year's donations.

2. Start an online fundraiser. Facebook, GiveMN and other online fundraisers

make it simple to start a personal campaign for Veterans. It is becoming very common for our supporters to start an online fundraiser for a birthday in place of gifts. Just share why you think this is important and challenge everyone to give.
