Point-in-Time Count January 2022

Nearly 600,000 Americans are currently experiencing homelessness. That's twice the population of St. Paul. You might ask how professionals in the homeless service field determine this figure. As you might imagine, teams of supporters work together to count those experiencing homelessness during an annual event called a Place-in-Time (PIT) count. The PIT count helps providers like MACV ensure that we're not surprised by new statistics or influxes of new people needing supportive services. Read more

Partner Highlights Lennar's Commitment: Stable Housing for Veterans

The Lennar Foundation has committed \$300,000 to MACV this year for four housing projects throughout North Minneapolis. These new four-bedroom homes will include accessory dwelling units (ADU) to provide additional flexibility in housing options. These homes will help us provide a safe space for Veterans as they work with our staff to receive support and resources to move toward independent living. Since 2018, Lennar has completed five homes for MACV to use for transitional services. In that time, these homes have served 81 Veterans and family members. We are grateful to Lennar for their continued commitment to Minnesota's Veterans and our community.
